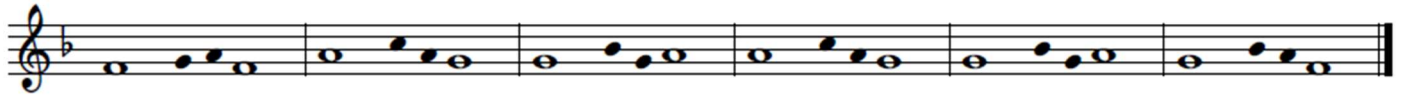

and save the lives of the needy.

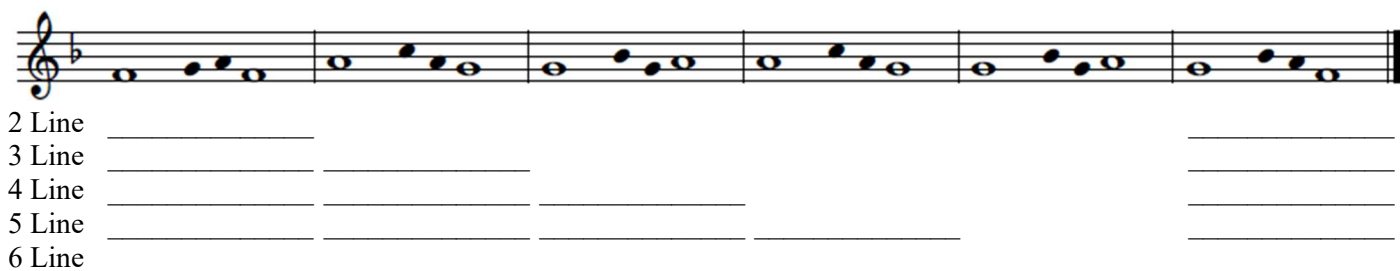

the LORD who ***protects the*** stranger.

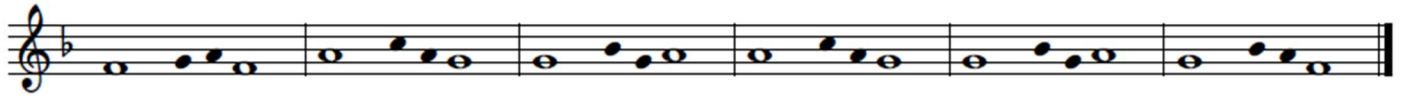
