to enquire at his Temple.

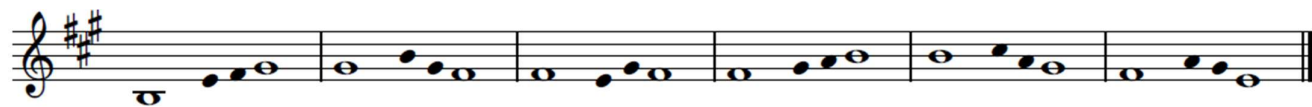
