and security be in your towers.

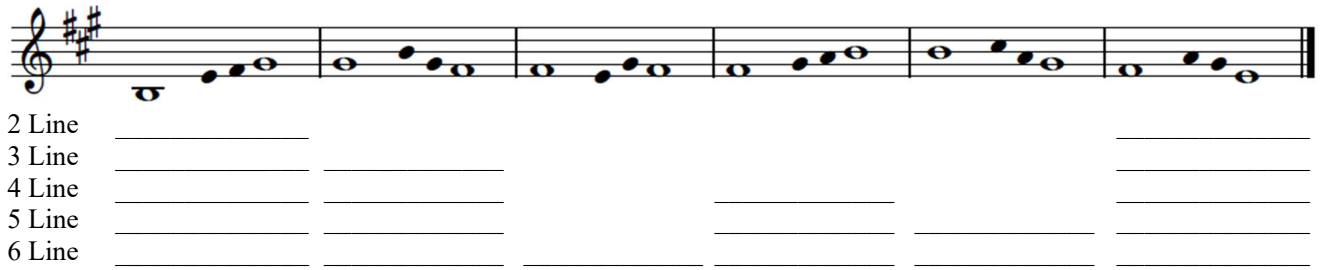

and save the lives of the needy.

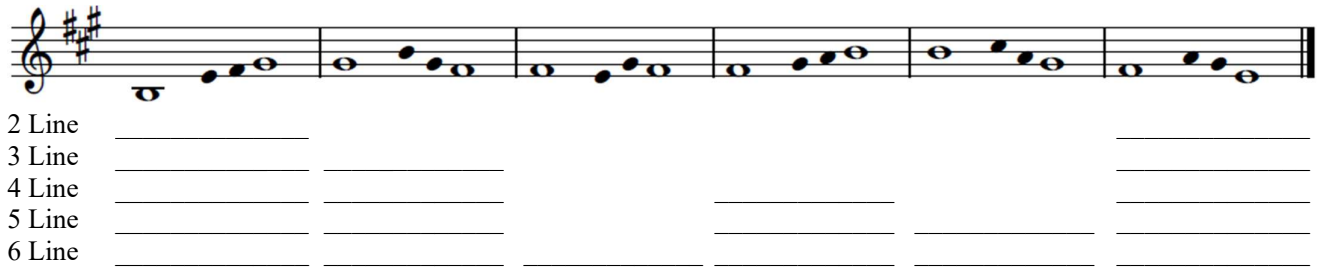

the LORD who *protects the* stranger.

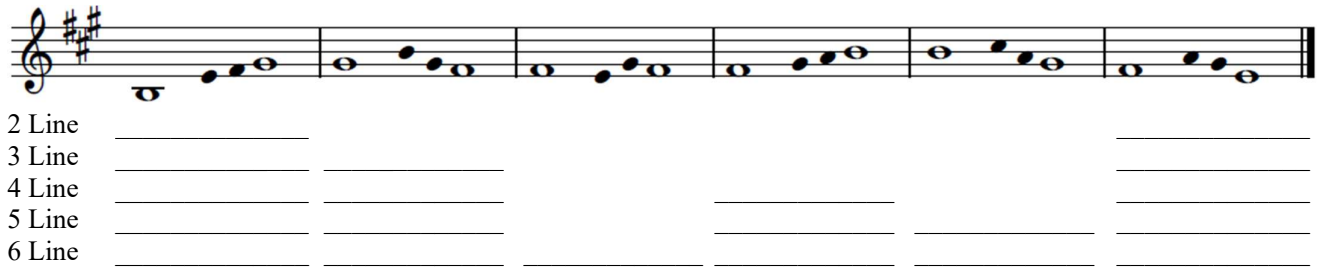
